1968	Intergovernmental Conference for Rational Use and Conservation of the Biosphere (UNESCO) is held; early discussions occur on the concept of ecologically sustainable development. This conference is only held on that day
1969	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• "Friends of the Earth" which is an international organization, forms as an advocacy organization dedicated to the prevention of environmental degradation, the preservation of diversity and the role of citizens in decision-making.• National Environmental Policy Act is passed in the United States, making it one of the first countries to establish a national legislative framework to protect the environment. The law sets the basis for environmental impact assessment in the world.
1978	Founex Report is prepared by a panel of experts calling for the integration of environment and development strategies.
1982	UN conference on Sustainable development and the UNEP takes place. The Stockholm conference is rooted in the pollution and acid rain problems of northern Europe. It leads to the establishment of many national environmental protection agencies and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP).
2005	Kyoto protocol is put into force legally binding developed country parties to goals for greenhouse gas emission reductions and establishing the Clean Development Mechanism for developing countries. Emissions reductions obligations expire at the end of 2012.

TOPIC DISCUSSION

✚ How can youth empowerment affect sustainable development?

The development of the youth has a very positive background starting in the early 1930's. More specifically it was around that time that multiple organizations such as scouts, boys' and girls' clubs and the Y.M.C.A were developed. These organizations along with many others extended the range of education and made it widely available in most developed countries. Organizations

United Nations Development Program (UNDP):

The UNDP, also known as the United Nations Development Program, was founded in 1965 in New York City where it still holds its main offices. It was created by the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) and its goal is to connect countries and supply them with knowledge and resources, in order for their people to have a better life. Furthermore, it provides advice, training and support to developing countries, with increasing emphasis on assistance to the least developed countries. It promotes technical and investment cooperation among nations. The status of UNDP is that of an executive board within the United Nations General Assembly. The UNDP was the organ that decided upon the 17 Sustainable Development Goals, which are supposed to be easily tackled by every country, though unfortunately this has not been the case. The UNDP also set a youth program for sustainable development and peace. This is a 5-year program on youth empowerment, designed to sharpen the organization's response to the challenges young people face worldwide.



2011 African Union on Sustainable development and Youth

The African Union held a conference in 2011 on Sustainable Development and Youth, where it was discussed what the African countries can do in order to achieve sustainable development as well as what they can do in order to help the youth. Also, they discussed over the domestication for implementation which came through the 2063 agenda. Agenda 2063 is a concrete and implementable framework with a clear vision, 7 aspirations, 20 goals and 39 priority areas. Lastly it was discussed how the African countries can assure that the 2063 Agenda would fulfil its purpose and how it was going to be implanted in all countries.



Countries

Sweden

Sweden is the country which ranks highest in the world in the fulfilment the sustainable development goals. Indeed, they are ranked first in 7 of the 23 categories of the Sustainable Development Goals and in the top 10 in all of them. However, there are challenges that they still have to face. Firstly, they have to remain environmentally friendly and make sure that the current democratic government's policies do not change, as they have been very successful and beneficial. Moreover, it is advised that they should not take anything for granted and should continue constantly improving their environment. Lastly, they ought to inform their younger generations of how they can continue influencing the world correctly.

Democratic Republic of Congo (DR Congo)

The Democratic Republic of Congo is one of the countries that have been neglecting the Sustainable Development Goals, given that over the past years they have not shown any progress in their achievement. Furthermore, the current government claim that they do not have the finances to support the ecological development of the country and would rather focus on strengthening the military . Lastly, they are a tropical country, one of the most diverse in the world concerning their environment as they have a lot of forests as well as rivers, and although it has been suggested to them by the UN and other countries to focus on the environment, but they ignore the suggestions.

Given that access to education in the country is not always easy, youth are not aware of the concepts of sustainable development or youth empowerment either.

Central African Republic

The Central African Republic rank in the bottom half of every sustainable goal something which is showcased by their ranking as the country with the least development. Although they have started to improve their lack of sustainability, they still have a long way to go if they want to improve their ranking. They are also a country who claim to be financially unable to achieve all goals, however they don't think that it is impossible to achieve some like having a sustainable life on land as they are home to many forests with endangered species



but with help they have started getting in control of the situation. Therefore, they are trending in the right direction but still have a long time to go if they want to be considered environmentally friendly.

Youth awareness about the situation is questionable, with youth empowerment movements in the world as being very underprivileged and blocked from the rest of the world. They are underprivileged as the country that they come from does not have a successful economy and blocked from the world because a big percentage of their population lives without technology and therefore cannot get informed about the situation in the rest of the world.

United States of America (U.S.A)

In the U.S.A sustainable development in has taken a toll, as the new President neglects global warming and takes no action against it. Furthermore, the measures that have been passed are beneficial towards businessmen who are ecologically unfriendly. However, this due to the fact that the President's main supporters are businessmen who harm the environment on a regular basis.

Contrariwise, the youth empowerment movement is the strongest in the world. In the U.S.A the youth constantly fight for their rights and start demonstrations protesting against everything they deem to be wrong. A great example would be the recent school walk that happened after the second school shooting in a month, in Texas on May 18th, 2018 by Dimitrios Pagourtzis.

China

China has one of the most polluted environments worldwide and that is because of the presence of numerous factories in the region. Nonetheless, the Chinese government have decided their position as one of the countries with extreme pollution must change and they have started shifting upwards and have started becoming more ecologically friendly.

The youth in China are aware of sustainable development and have been fighting for the government to become friendly to the environment. However, the concept of youth empowerment in China is not promoted because the Chinese education does not allow it. However, if the Chinese youth wanted to take example they could take a look to their neighbors in Honk Kong who have one of the strongest youth empowerment movements in the world.



Russian Federation

One large part of Russia is ecologically friendly, and that is Siberia. In the other cities of Russia, the environment is not of high quality, but it still not that polluted either. That is because the Russian people have always been eco-friendly, and the factories do not have that many poisonous gasses eliminated, as many products are ecologically friendly.
